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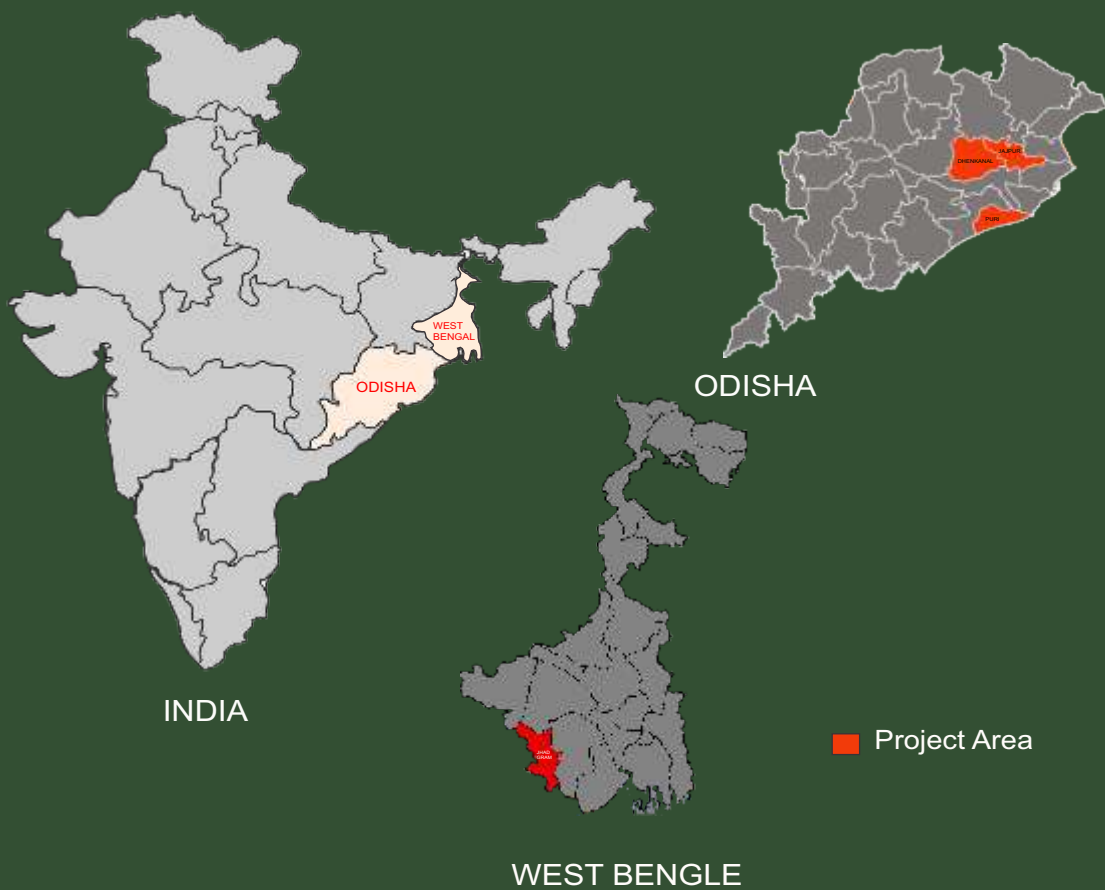

Reflections



Director, NAMM

We are delighted to share with you, our annual activities for the year 2019-2020. It was a year of strengthening our existing work and experimenting novel ideas. It was a year of learning and reflections. As a team, we cherished the contributions by each of the team members, invested in enhancing skills and team spirit as well as sharpened our collective action to achieve our vision of a more equitable society. We have tried to link whatever small we did with the larger goal of state's development and the global Sustainable Development Goals. During the year, we have touched upon the larger goals of no poverty, zero hunger, good health, quality education, gender equality, clean water and climate action. This annual report highlights what, why and how we contributed to bring changes in these areas during 2019-20.

The year 2019-2020 was a year of setting up new milestones for NAMM. During the year NAMM extended its thematic approach and started working in the areas of disaster preparedness. Along with this, the programmes on health, livelihood, skill building, entrepreneurship promotion and education are continued in different project areas both in the states of Odisha and West Bengal. In the month of May, when cyclone Fani created devastations in Puri district of Odisha, NAMM team has extended relief support to fifteen hundred households.

During the year, we worked with women self help groups, provided them training on different skills and provided them seed money support to start production cum business unit. As a result of this initiative, more than ten SHGs in our project location in Odisha are engaged in mushroom cultivation and marketing works. The health programme continued in the state of West Bengal and during this year, we had given a lot of focus on public health promotion activities. The carrier development centre that we are running in Jajpur Odisha trained more than 200 youths on employability skills.

NAMM is selected as the nodal agency in Dhenkanal district of Odisha by the district administration to carry out disaster prevention activities in the district. With the support of Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA) and district administration Dhenkanal, we had prepared village level disaster preparedness plans for more than 100 villages in Dhenkanal, Odisha. Across all our project locations, linking eligible individuals and households with social security schemes of government is a cross cutting initiative. During the year, we have successfully facilitated linkages of more than five thousand individuals and households with various schemes and programmes of both state and central government.

We express our profound appreciation to all the communities with whom we worked during the year. It is because of their support we could contribute positively. We are also very thankful to all our donors for conferring faith and confidence on us.

Improving Public Health & Nutrition

Many of the rural and tribal areas of our country lack quality health facilities. In order to address this issue National Association of Man for Mankind (NAMM) has taken up a mobile medical unit project in remote villages of Jhargram district of West Bengal with the support of Hans Foundation, New Delhi. The project is being implemented in 24 villages and aims at providing quality and affordable health services, with a special focus on women and children. We follow three major approaches while implementing this programme. Firstly we provide professional health services through the mobile medical unit to the communities who do not have access to government's health system. Secondly, we engage ourselves to build community awareness on various health and nutrition issues as well as factors contributing to that, focusing on the aspects of prevention, immediate community response in case of any disease outbreak. As the third approach, our team is engaged in training and providing hand holding support to frontline health workers, especially to the Anganwadi workers, ASHA and ANMs. Overall NAMM's health programme focuses on preventive, curative and promotional health.



Under the Mobile Medical project, NAMM has a dedicated team of doctors, nurses, pharmacists who on regular basis moves from one to other village and conducts regular health camps. During the health camp the doctor carefully assesses the patients for the possible health problems and provides medications to the patients. Whenever necessary, the doctor prescribes for pathological assessment for the patients for diagnosis purpose of patients. A group of community health workers follow up with patients regularly for the speedy recovery. Apart from MMU activity, regular community meetings and awareness activities are carried out in the villages on health related topics.

Health Highlights

- 989 health camps were organized by the mobile medical unit with a foot fall of 20,431 patients during the year.
- 7,057 pathology tests for the patients were conducted for the better assessment and treatment.
- 576 community meetings, 600 FGDs and around 5,760 home visits were conducted in the project villages during the year.
- A total of 1,100 malnourished children were supported and around 2,000 mothers supported for Anemia. During this year around 800 mothers were provided ANC and PNC check up and counselled for better health measures during pregnancy.
- NAMM has reached 1,756 households and around 65,000 populations directly and brought positive change in their lives. Indirectly more than one lakh populations are impacted.

Livelihood and Skill Building

Indian society is an agrarian society with more than 80% population living in the villages and pursuing agriculture as their primary source of livelihood. However, Agriculture as never being given due importance and therefore it is not catered as profitable for the farmers. NAMM has been always vocal and proactive on this issue.

Since long it has been working on agro based livelihood promotion and skill development of the rural populace. Currently, NAMM is catering a project on this issue in 40 villages of Jajpur district in Odisha. The project is supported by TATA Power, IEL and TPCDT. Under livelihood and Skill Building

programm, the activities carried out in the year 2019-2020 have different aspects. On the one hand, NAMM has worked closely with the women self help groups as well as farmers built their capacities and supported for agro based entrepreneurship activities. On the other hand we have worked with women and youth for their skill development and supported them for getting meaningful employment.



Mushroom Farming

NAMM has carried out five training programs on Mushroom Training with the help of Odisha University of Agriculture and Technology (OUAT) Bhubaneswar in the project areas. Apart from this field training programs and demonstrations were carried out by experts from OUAT. Through our effort mushroom farming was undertaken by 20 SHGs and 150 people of the project areas as an livelihood option.

Employability Training

The Carrier Development Centre which is operational at Duburi, Jajpur is providing job ready skills, preparing students for the competitive examinations in free of cost and in subsidized rates. The centre has an agreement with Tata Consulting Service (TCS) which after a specific job course selects the candidates for employment in the company. During the year 2019-2020, the centre has also started special courses on competitive examinations which include banking, Staff Selection Board etc.

Tailoring Training Center

NAMM has started a Tailroing training cum production center in Duburi, Jajpur district. Around 25 women are working in the training center. The training cum prodcuton center is now prodcuinnng different types of garmenrts. The poduction center is selling these garments to earn money. This center has created an oppertunty for the women and young girl to gain some meaningfull income.

Livelihood and Skill Highlights

- NAMM reached 1,500 households under its livelihood intervention in Jajur district of Odisha.
- Through mushroom training we were able to help around 300 families who now are following this as an alternative livelihood method to earn money and make their lives and families live a better life.
- NAMM has conducted training of women SHG members on poultry farming, vegetable gardening and goat rearing activities. Around 5 SHGS have taken of poultry farming and 100 house hold taken goat rearing activities as livelihood programme.
- The carrier Development Center has provided employability training to 200 students. Out of these 200 students 23 students were placed with Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and 35 students in other agencies. The organization has arrangements with TCS in which TCS provides training to the students and then TCS takes eligible students among them after interviewing.
- In tailoring training cum production center 25 girls have enrolled and learning tailoring. It gave edge to the production capabilities to the center; the center is now currently producing five different garments and is sold in the market.

Improving Access to Drinking Water and Sanitation

Access to pure drinking water is a major issue in the rural areas of Jajpur district of Odisha. In order to address this with the support of Tata Power Community Development Trust (TPCDT), NAMM has developed eight over head water tanks with piped water supply system to the communities. Although during the year 2019-2020 no new construction has been done but the focus was on repairing as well as maintenance of these water supply infrastructures. As a step towards climate action, all these over head tanks and the supply system is equipped with solar energy.

Hygiene and sanitation campaign

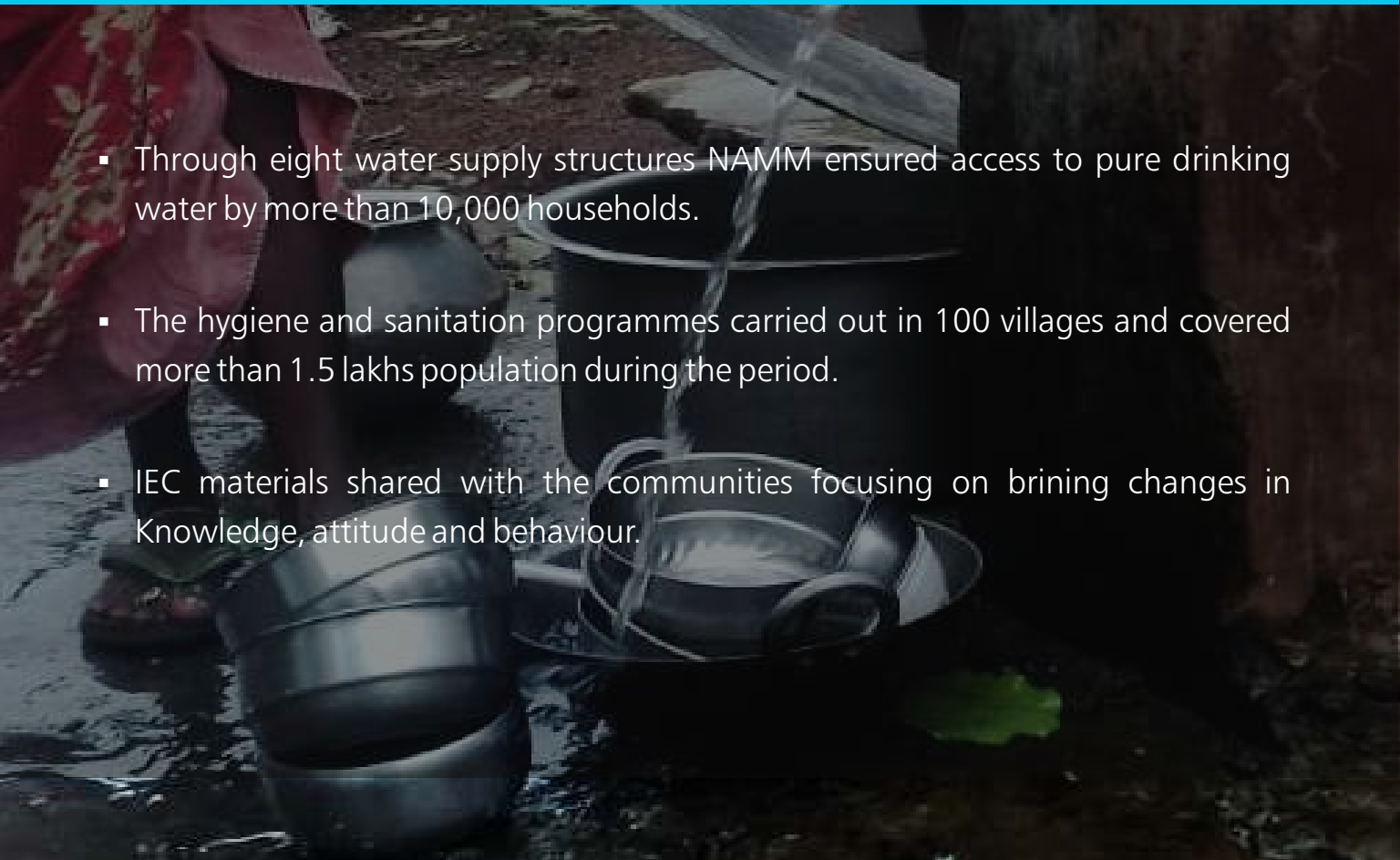
Across all the projects of NAMM both in the state of Odisha and West Bengal, improving hygiene and sanitation is given due importance. NAMM has observed 15th October as the Global hand washing day and organized hand washing awareness campaign across all its project villages. Children and women were specially mobilized and oriented on different steps of hand washing. During the period of January to March 2020, NAMM has also initiated awareness programmes on importance of hand washing, wearing masks, social distancing etc., especially in the context of covid19 outbreak. Along with it, NAMM mobilized the SHGs and VDCs time to time to organize village cleanliness drives. NAMM also focused on linking eligible house holds with govts flagship Swachh Bharat Mission for improving access and use of toilets by the households.





Water and Sanitation Highlights

- Through eight water supply structures NAMM ensured access to pure drinking water by more than 10,000 households.
- The hygiene and sanitation programmes carried out in 100 villages and covered more than 1.5 lakhs population during the period.
- IEC materials shared with the communities focusing on bringing changes in Knowledge, attitude and behaviour.

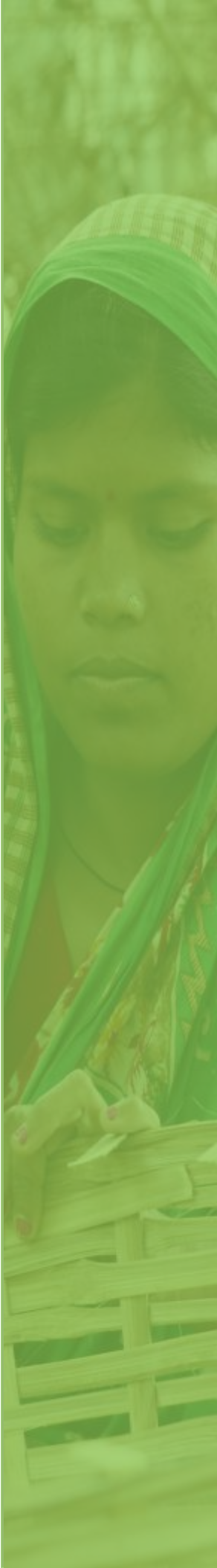


Access to Entitlement Programme

Access to Entitlement Programme

Across all the project villages, NAMM has been focusing on improving people's access to basic rights and entitlements. There are number of government programmes designed for people in form of rights and entitlements and many time there remains a gap in identification of beneficiaries, lack of awareness and information among the beneficiaries, lack of demands and corruption. Due to many such issues common people could not access the rights and entitlements. NAMM has been focusing on identifying the beneficiaries, facilitating application process, linking beneficiaries and following up with local government in this regard. Following rights and entitlements are covered under the programme.

- Right to Food Act
- Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act
- Right to Education Act
- Insurance, social security pension, gas connection schemes
- Other welfare schemes of state and central government

Linking households with Public Distribution System

In all the operational villages, NAMM took up an initiative to link the eligible but excluded households under the public distribution system. The issue of exclusion came up in village meetings and therefore, identification, process of applications for linkages was carried out in a campaign mode. It was done on the basis of the provisions mentioned under the National Food Security Act and state specific schemes.

Campaign on MGNREGA and linking with other livelihood schemes

NAMM has conducted annual campaigns and mobilized people to apply for work under MGNREGA. Along with it rounds of discussions were carried out with the women self help group members to understand their need and link them with livelihood mission program.

Linking households with other developmental programme and schemes

NAMM also facilitated linkage of the individuals and households with other schemes and entitlements. They include take home ration under ICDS, Pradhan Mantri Ujjala Yojana, various insurance schemes etc.

Linking the households with health insurance scheme

Every state government and the central government have some kind of insurance schemes for the public who can't afford high cost of the treatment. Our community workers carry out campaigns and convergence programs to make people inducted in to the health insurance scheme of the government.

Ensuring right to education of children

As a cross cutting issue, in all the project villages NAMM ensured enrolment of children in age appropriate classes and followed up with the teachers and parents on their study. NAMM has also supported children with learning materials.

Building Disaster Resilience Communities

Cyclone Fani relief programme

Disaster has been one of the significant thematic areas for NAMM. NAMM's disaster work includes not only providing relief support to communities but also to build them more resilience to all forms of disasters. During the year of 2019-20, NAMM has responded to cyclone Fani that has crossed the Odisha coast during the month of May 2019. Cyclone Fani hit the coastal areas of Puri and created devastations. With the support of Tata Power, NAMM carried out relief programmes in 20 severely affected villages of Puri. Dry rations, hygiene kits, clothes, solar lights etc. were distributed to more than 10,000 households. Along with Tata Power, NAMM volunteers also raised material support from affluent persons and distributed the relief materials in the communities.

District level disaster preparedness action

During the year, NAMM worked closely with the District Administration of Dhenkanal, District Disaster Management Authority, Dhenkanal and Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA) to prepare community level disaster preparedness plans. NAMM has conducted a series of meetings at the community level, organized rural appraisals, interacted with all sections of the villages in more than 100 villages to prepare these community level plans.

NAMM has also formed Village Disaster Mitigation Committees and Task force on disaster management in around 250 villages in Dhenkanal district. Orientation of these committee members time to time and campaign on disaster related issues have also been conducted by the organization.

NAMM has been appointed as a nodal agency of Dhenkanal district of Odisha to carry out disaster related activities in the district by the District Administration.



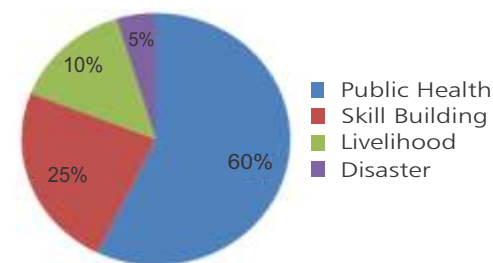
Relief Distribution During Disaster around 250 villages in Dhenkanal district of Odisha

Finances

Distribution of fund spending as per thematic areas

There are four major projects implemented by NAMM during the year 2019-2020 with the support of external donors.

NAMM has also taken up some initiatives in different operational villages as cross cutting issues. As per as institutional funding and the areas of intervention is concerned, during the year 2019-2020, a substantial portion of the funds were used for public health promotion and nutrition initiatives. Apart from this other programme like livelihood initiatives, skill building were also major programmes. The livelihood Program is the second program which got the major funds.
