This document is also a reflection of support we received in terms of resources and of our abilities to deliver with that. While presenting this report, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our communities, donors, and well-wishers, without whom our journey could never be fulfilled.

NAMM journey in the year 2021-2022 has been very challenging. The effect of covid continued to affect our communities as well as us as an organization. On the one hand there were huge need at the community level and on other hand there was a resource crunch and in between these two situations, NAMM has made a balance and continued serving communities with best of its abilities.

During the year, NAMM continued its focus on providing primary health care at the doorstep. The health care programme in West Bengal reached out and served people in 24 villages. The focus has been on maternal child health, adolescent health, and care for elderly people. NAMM is also in the process and have started preparing for

taking up a project on community health outreach in the state of Jharkhand. In Odisha, our engagement with the women Self Help Groups continued. We trained more than 200 SHG members on financial literacy, basic accounting and on various social issues. The SHG members were capacitated and engaged in different income generation activities and through this we have directly reached out to 8,000 population. We are also in the process of building the capacity of bamboo crafts practitioners and planning to establish a training center for them. Through this we aim at building their skills and creating a market opportunity for them so that their livelihood source is strengthened further.

We look forward to the next year with excitement and promise ourselves to continue our work with commitment and dedication. We are again thankful to all our supporters, well-wishers, communities and our own team members for their contribution and support.

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Introduction

NAMM (National Association of Man from Mankind) started as a youth brigade in Chirulei village, Dhenkanal district of the state of Odisha and later it was given a legal frame work of a society. Since its inception in 1993, NAMM works for the development of impoverished and undeveloped communities of society. The main beneficiaries of NAMM are people belonging to tribal communities, Dalit communities, women and children. The main thematic areas of our work are health specifically on the health issues related RMNCH+A, development of disaster resilience communities, livelihood generation and women empowerment.

In the recent years we have established ourselves as a multi-state agency but mostly confined ourselves within the tribal belts of eastern India. Our work of providing basic health care services and eradicating under nutrition among the Lodha tribes of Jhargram district was greatly appreciated.

We are also organizing artisans of lantana and bamboo of tribal villages of Manoharpur block Westsinghbhum district of Jharkhand for a community based alternative livelihood generation program. We are also a planning to run a MMU to provide basic health care services to the tribal peoples of the village.

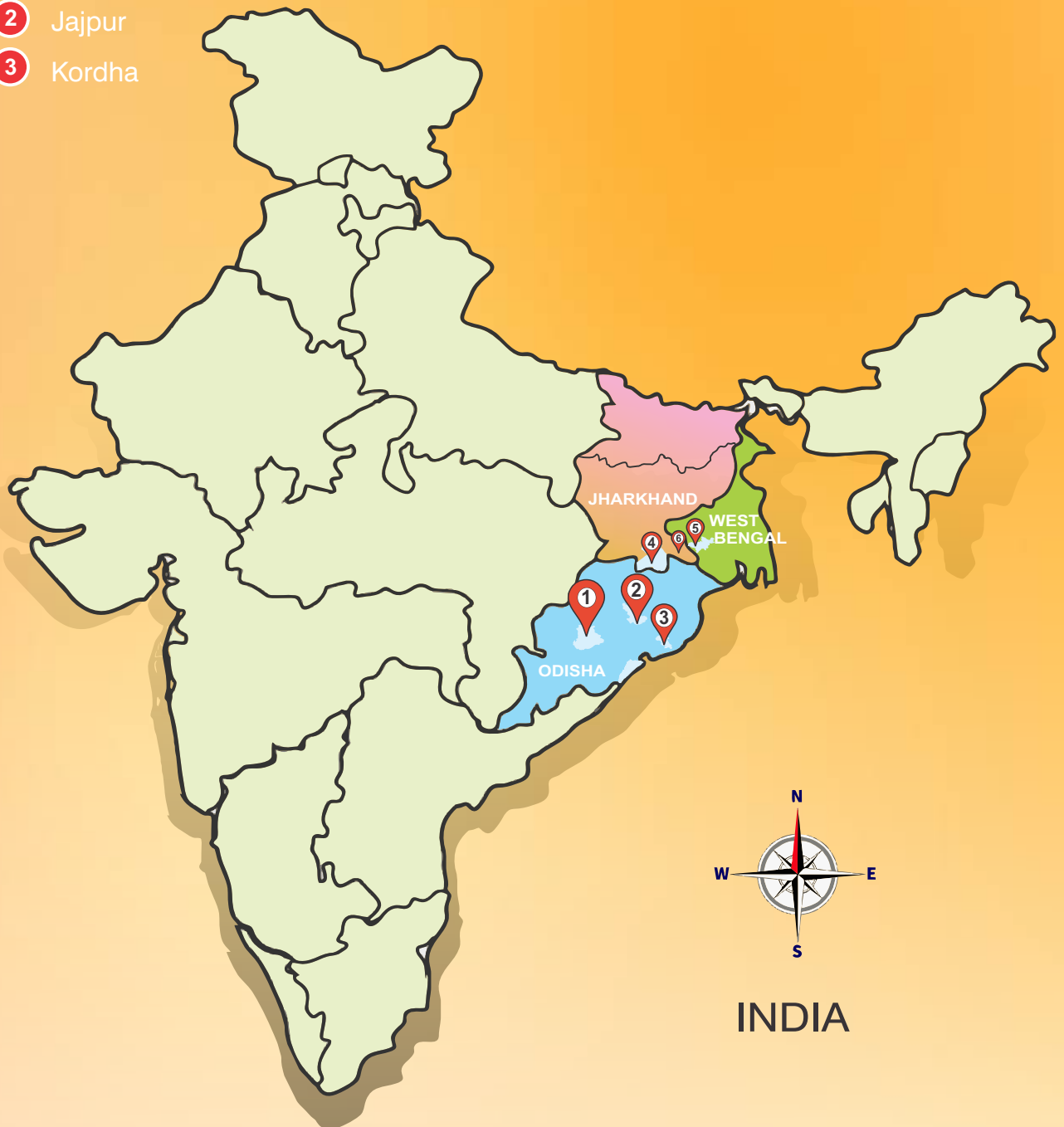

Health and Nutrition

Health is a priority area of intervention for National Association of Man for Mankind. NAMM provides basic health care services and referral services to the rural tribal population. The health projects of NAMM are being carried out in Jhargram district of West Bengal and West singhbhum district of Jharkhand. During the year 2021-22 NAMM provided health care services to around 1,50,000 people through Health camps. Out of these people around 75% are women and adolescent girls.

Since our inception we have been working for the better alternative livelihood generation activities for the people of the rural areas. We carry out training programs with the help of government and non government organizations, facilitates for the provision of necessary financial assistance to provide them with working capital to start the activity, help them introducing their products in the market and provides knowledge them on financial management.

Through the coordinated effort of our team, we were able to develop 25 entrepreneurs and 6 agripreneurs in project villages.



Women Empowerment

Self-Help Group or in-short SHG is now a well-known concept. The SHGs have a role in hastening country's economic development. SHGs have now evolved as a movement. Participation of women in the country's economic development is increasing. They also play an important role in elevating the economic status of their families. This has led boost to the process of women's empowerment. Women SHGs are now changing the economic and scenario of the rural areas through their effort on creating sustainable income generation activities. With the help of TPCODL and OLM we have given training to 103 SHG members in Meter Reading and Bill Collection activity and engaged them in this activity.

We have trained members of 53 SHGs in meter reading, billing and bill collection activities and engaged in the same activity.

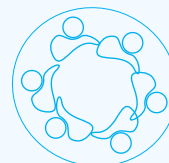


Skill Development

Health And Nutrition

Although the ongoing COVID 19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown has somewhat dampened the spirit of mankind the team of NAMM have continuously worked throughout the year making this year as one of the successful years. This year we have carried out 936 health camps in which more than 40,000 patients were treated.

As COVID pandemic has brought a significant inertness in the functioning of the government hospitals and also due to fear of contracting the infection many people abhorred themselves from going to the hospitals and in such a time of need we provided them the much-needed health care services in the village.

During this period of pandemic, we carried out 458 awareness sessions in the project villages to aware them regarding various proven measures to decrease the spread of the diseases. 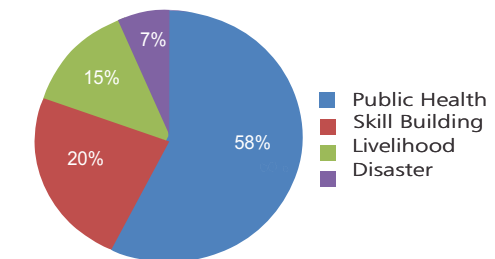


Finances
