Under the current project NAMM is focusing on improving overall maternal health situation in the project villages. Along with the mobile medical camps regular follow up has been done with the pregnant mothers and the family members to ensure they are regularly taking nutritious food and also motivated for institutional delivery. Till date we had identified 51 pregnant mothers and working with them. Following are some of the cases which we followed.



Menaka is a 23 year mother from Kuldiha village of Nayagram block. She had delivered a baby boy on 29th July in Kharika Mathani CHC. Last year, She was identified by NAMM's health worker when she was pregnant. Our health worker counseled her and motivated her to take nutritious food. She was regularly followed up for ANC check up.

Our team also motivated the husband and wife to choose the institutional delivery option for safety purpose. Though initially reluctant but finally the couple decided after series of counseling.



It was because of the health worker of NAMM we had chosen to go the hospital for delivery and also received financial assistance. The health worker visited to our family in a regular interval and showed us different materials on nutrition and health care during pregnancy; said Sita Hansda and her husband Babulu Hansda who belongs to Chiripiti village.



Sakuntala will be around 30 and was married to Saroj singh of Arrah village. She has delivered a baby girl after twelve years of marriage. After knowing about her pregnancy NAMM team visited her house and interacted both with the husband and wife on nutrition, ANC and care during pregnancy. Sakuntala chosen institutional delivery and she is a happy mother now.



Saraswati and her husband Babulal expressed their happiness when NAMM team visited to their home. She has delivered a baby boy and it is her second child after the girl. Saraswati has also attended our health camp and regularly interacted with our gynecologist as well as our health worker. She was motivated for institutional delivery. At present our health worker are trying to convince the couple for family planning.



Sarpa Murmu is 21 years of age and married to Sriram Murmu of Baligeria village. On 4th of September 2015, She became the mother and it was a baby Girl. The baby was delivered in the Kaharika Mathani government hospital and was 2.0 kilo weight at birth. Both mother and the baby are fine now. All of this happened because of our regular intervention. When Sarpa came to one of our health camp, she was identified as anemic. She was given medicines and our health worker regularly counseled her. We also motivated her for the institutional delivery linked her with financial support under government programme.
